The department was organized in 1924 and was named the "Department of Social Hygiene"; after the Great Patriotic War it was renamed the Department of Healthcare Organization; in the late 60s it became the Department of Social Hygiene and Healthcare Organization, in 1994 - Social Medicine, and since 2000 it has had its current name - the "Department of Public Health, Healthcare and History of Medicine". Professor Isaac Yakovlevich Edelman, who headed the department in 1924, additionally taught a separate course in epidemiology and optional lectures on the history of medicine.



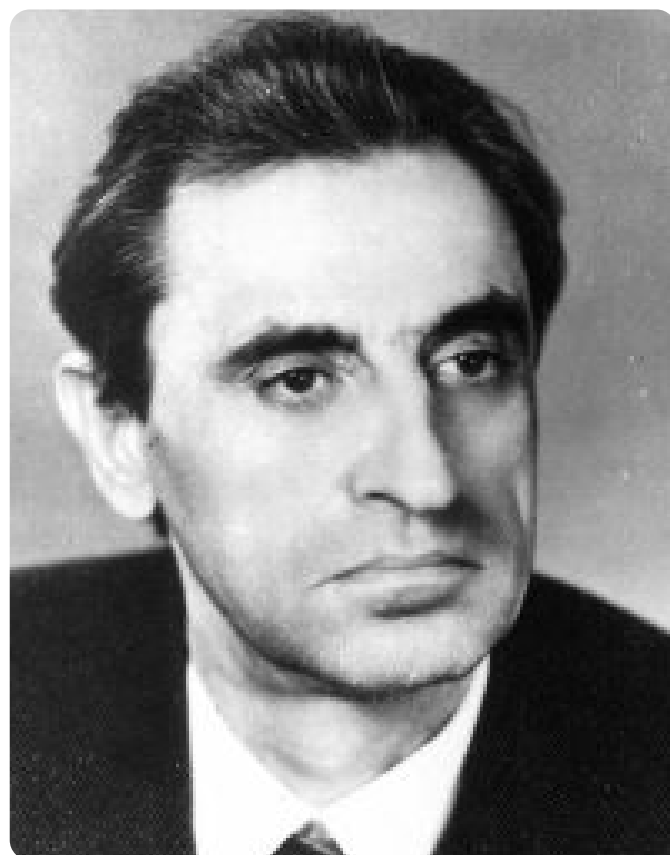
From 1940 to 1952, the department was headed by Professor Mikhail Lazarevich Bensman, who graduated from the Novorossiysk University (Odesa), participated as a doctor in the First World War, and served in the Red Army.

Since 1951, the course of lectures on the history of medicine was given by Associate Professor Grigory Nikolaevich Kovalsky, who worked for a long time as the institute's vice-rector for research work and headed the course of epidemiology.

For two years, teaching was conducted on the course of health care organization, which was headed by Candidate of Medical Sciences Tatyana Illarionovna Nesterenko.

In 1954, Vadim Aleksandrovich Nesterov took over the department. Under his leadership, classical medical and social research in Kuban was established – a comprehensive study of disability in the region was conducted. Under the supervision of Professor V.A. Nesterov, more than 25 dissertations were completed over 30 years. For a long time, he was a member of the editorial board of the journal "Healthcare of the Russian Federation". V.A. Nesterov is a participant in the Great Patriotic War, was awarded military orders and medals.

In 1984-1992, the course "Introduction to the Specialty" at the department was taught by Associate Professor Tatyana Vladimirovna Ivanovskaya, who worked as the Vice-Rector of the Institute for Academic Affairs from 1970 to 1975.



From 1983 to 2012, the department was headed by one of the first postgraduate students of Professor V.A. Nesterov, Doctor of Medical Sciences Boris Andreevich Voitsekhovich. Under his supervision, 43 dissertations were defended, including 5 doctoral dissertations. A great achievement of the department staff under the supervision of Professor B.A. Voitsekhovich was the achievement of research on a new level within the framework of international contacts on initiative projects (Center for the Study of Population Health Trends in Eastern Europe and Russia, Stockholm University, Sweden); work on a grant from the Open Society International Institute; participation in an international study of population aging processes conducted in Russia under the auspices of the World Health Organization (2008).

In 2012, the department was headed by Doctor of Medical Sciences, Professor Andrei Nikolaevich Redko.

From the moment the department was organized and until the middle of the 20th century, the medical and social research of the employees concerned mainly the epidemiology of infectious diseases and the study of the impact of industrial environment conditions on health. The first heads of the department, professors I. Ya. Edelman and M. L. Bensman, remaining mainly representatives of the traditional hygienic direction, actively worked in the bureau of medical and sanitary statistics, connecting student training with the organization of medical care for the population of Kuban. In the middle of the last century, the emphasis was shifted to an integrated assessment of population health indicators. This was based on large-scale studies of physical development, morbidity, disability, and mortality. The works of professor V. A. Nesterov and his students determined the direction in disability research in our country for many years. The department was the leading scientific center for disability research in the USSR. Research was conducted by employees of our university, researchers from other universities in the country, and scientists from foreign countries. The continuity of the scientific school created at the department served to develop, under the leadership of professor B. A. Voitsekhovich, a new scientific direction, "Medical and social aspects of the formation of population health and ways to improve it." A major achievement of the research team during this period was the advancement of research to the international level and cooperation with the Center for the Study of Population Health Trends in Eastern Europe and Russia (University of Stockholm, Sweden), work on a grant from the Open Society International Institute, and participation in an international study of population aging processes conducted in Russia under the auspices of the World Health Organization. At the turn of the 20th and 21st centuries, the emphasis in the department's scientific research began to shift to the study of socially significant diseases. Professor A.N. Redko formed a new conceptual direction and developed a methodology for analyzing socially dangerous pathology. A large section of the department's scientific work was the study of suicides, injuries, and drug addiction. The research results were used in the preparation of "State reports on the health status of the population of the Russian Federation", analytical materials to substantiate activities within the framework of the national project "Health" and the development of a number of directive and program documents at the federal level. Given the multidisciplinary nature of teaching at the department, much attention is paid to scientific research at the junction of various research areas. The leading ones are the study of modern aspects of public health development (A.N. Redko, G.I. Gurbich, V.V. Pil'shchikova, S.V. Gubarev), improvement of approaches to organizing medical care for the population (S.K. Akhedzhak-Naguze, A.S. Fuks, A.V. Zobenko, A.G. Zhilina, V.R. Khan, V.V. Martynenko, A.E. Babich, N.V. Nesterenko, M.A. Kovalchuk), analysis of economic aspects of healthcare (I.S. Lebedeva, T.A. Shiltsova, V.V. Kupina), improvement of information and technical support for medical activities (V.Ya. Zobenko, M.A. Korogod, I.A. Beloglyadova, A.A. Kushnereva), study of historical and medical heritage at the regional level (D.V. Veselova, Yu.A. Vasiliev).
